City Assessor Rodningen addressed the Council regarding the property value increases required by County and State regulations. There was an overall decrease in commercial property by 3% and residential lots were increased. Properties within 12% of a recent sale were not adjusted.

overhauled in the current Hustler instead of purchasing a new mower, estimated the cost of repairs is \$600-\$700, carried.
