Visitors:

Harold Rotunda, **CPA** presented the 2009 Audit reports. He commented that overall the City is doing quite well and had a very good year with lots of progress.

Bill Geffre addressed the Council regarding his building located at 411 Main Avenue. The Council has defined this a dangerous building and set a 30 day deadline for removal at the June 22 Special City Council meeting. Bill went over the inspection reports again and stated he would like to repair the building in lieu of demolition. Different contractors have been contacted regarding demolition and no estimates have been received yet. City Attorney Gary Neuharth stated the time frame was shortened due to the deterioration of the building providing an imminent danger to the community and the 30 days will remain in effect until Bill provides an itemized list of repairs including costs plus a time frame/schedule and estimates of demolition can all be reviewed by the Council.

Moore Engineering:

Jerod Klabunde updated the Council on the current projects.

2009-2 Phase 1 Water and Sewer Improvements The current schedule for the Main Avenue construction has the underground work completed within a week, sidewalks and street lights will be worked on by next week. Businesses have been notified that during the sidewalk replacement access will be very limited or unavailable for a couple of days. Pavement is scheduled for the end of July. Fir Avenue has not been filled in or paved due to the wet conditions. Different soil and millings are being placed there to hopefully dry out the area to be paved the same time as Main Avenue.

2006-1 Water Treatment Plant The final grant money has been submitted to Rural Development and will be closed shortly.

2010-1 Phase 2 Water and Sewer Improvements The plans and specs are complete and waiting for Rural Development approval. The bid opening date is currently scheduled for July 29, 2010. There are continuing discussions with ND Department of Transportation to possibly use concrete instead of asphalt on Highway 1 within the city limits.

2010-2 JVG/SDWG Preconstruction meeting will be held July 8 at City Hall.

Safe Routes to School Grant Kuipers moved, Rosendahl second to accept grant funding of \$150,000.00 from the ND Department of Transportation to install sidewalks from the Westside Softball Complex to Main Avenue and Main Avenue along Willow Park, carried.

Rosendahl moved, Sitzler second to approve engineering invoice for 2009-2 Phase 1\$34,739.19, carried Kuipers moved, Rosendahl second to approve engineering invoice for 2009-2 Phase 1 Main Avenue Enhancements \$26,150.00, carried.

Rosendahl moved, Kuipers second to approve engineering invoice for 2010-1 Phase 2 \$153,500.00, carried. Sitzler moved, Rosendahl second to approve engineering invoice for 2010-2 \$115,642.65, carried. Sitzler moved, Forward second to approve Pay Estimate for 2009-2 Phase 1 to Kuechle Underground for \$247,317.03, carried.

Committee Reports:

Streets, curb on Hickory Avenue between 12th Street and 13th Street will be replaced and the tree removed. Pat Nelson will speak with the property owner. **Garbage**, a meeting was held with a representative from Sanitation Products regarding the outstanding expenses for the garbage truck. The City has requested payment from them for an estimated \$20,000 plus an analysis and plan for future problems. No response has been received but they have expressed they are willing to negotiate. **Water**, Moore Engineering will be contacted to research the possibilities of "looping" the water main installed last fall on east Main Avenue back to 16th Street. **Mayor Zimmer** will be scheduling meetings each month with Department Heads to discuss any concerns they might have also he requested for portfolio members to bring concerns and complaints to the Mayor and Department Heads before Council meetings so they can be handled more efficiently and solved quicker. Ordinance review will begin at next month's meetings, each portfolio will be given a chapter to review.

Unfinished Business:

Council Correspondence/Computers, estimates for a projector were received and discussed. The option of using a TV rather than a projector was also discussed, estimates will be gathered for next meeting.

New Business:

Second Reading of Sales Tax Ordinance Sitzler moved, Forward second to approve ordinance for increase of sales tax of ½ cent as indicated by election results, roll call approved.

Cemetery Easement, Sitzler moved Forward second to approve easement for Central Power Electric Coop to have a transmission line along the cemetery, carried.

Lodging Tax was brought up to research and will be discussed at next meeting.
