Committee Reports:

Fire Department held their annual meeting with townships and discussed the formation of the district, there seemed to positive support. **Public Works**, construction will be starting soon, if any property owners notice any damage or have concerns they need to contact City Hall so the contractor can be notified. **Spring Clean-Up** will be scheduled for the week of May 6th and electronic recycling will be offered again. **Armory**, ProTech did inspect the roof again. Two holes were found and sealed; no leaks have been noticed since the repairs. The National Guard has stated they will be using the facility again for drill this summer. Repairs will be restarted and security will be improved. ProTech will return this summer to re-inspect the roof and do repairs as needed. **Finance**, Doug Schmit submitted bill for tiling approved in 2011 by the City Council. Online payment options for utility billing is being looked into, Haring will have more information on fees and programs at next meeting. **Housing**, Mayor Zimmer reported a committee has been established to look at options for helping the housing situation. Discussions have started to construct a new apartment building. More updates and news will be reported each month.
