### Special Assessment Hearing-Street Improvement District 2015-1:

No protests or comments were received.

Conklin moved; Engel second to introduce and approve RESOLUTION CONFIRMING ASSESSMENTS & DIRECTING CERTIFICATION AND LEVY FOR STREET IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT 2015-1, roll call approved.

Engel moved, O'Brien second to approve partial pay estimate #10 to Maguire Iron for \$52,761.55, carried. #### Committee Reports:

**Armory**, City has received unofficial notice the National Guard will be closing their Oakes station on November 15, 2016. Discussion regarding possible future uses of the facility including moving City offices to building. Committee will meet to discuss and review at future meetings. **Streets**, the curb on Ivy Avenue between 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Streets has degraded. The area is functionally accepted, and boulevard needs to be sloped and reseeded. Engineers will review and provide possible solutions at next meeting. **Trees**, ND Forest Service, has awarded the City a grant to replant the trees along the Hwy 1 Boulevard. The grant will match funds of cash and in-kind contributions. Boy Scouts have been contacted to help possibly with project that is scheduled to begin in the Spring.

### **Unfinished Business:**

**Cemetery Road**, no further information available regarding the status of funding or project approval.

#### New Business:

**Assessor Appointment**, O'Brien moved, Forward second to approve the appointment of E. Rod Rodningen as Assessor for a two-year term, carried.

**Tourism Advertisement** funding request received from Oakes Area Chamber of Commerce. Request was for half the cost of the advertisement in the ND Tourism Magazine, OEI was asked for remaining half. Engel moved, Strutz second to approve the request of \$1,562.50 from the lodging tax with the caveat for discussion to be held before agreeing to advertisement again, carried.
