City Council Meeting July 9, 2012

The City Council met at 6:00 PM at SE Regional Career and Technology Center-Community Room with the following members present: Mayor Zimmer and Council: Harris, Strutz, Brandriet, Engel and Forward. Sitzler was absent. Dangerous Building Hearing:

Ray Stenson reported to the Council the plans for the home at 715 Main Avenue. The home suffered fire damage over a year ago and nothing has been done to secure the property and it has become a danger and a public nuisance. Stenson stated the area with burn damage will be removed and home will have improvements complete by September to make it habitable. The Building Official and Pat Nelson will review his plans and a building permit will be applied for. A progress report will be given at the August City Council meeting.

Visitors:

Bill Geffre addressed the Council regarding invoice for his final payment for the demolition costs for 411 Main Avenue. He received a letter from the City Attorney stating the final agreement did not include any expressed or implied agreement the he retained the right of first refusal. Geffre disputes this and asked the minutes and recordings to be checked to verify. He also stated that he is unable to make the payment and requested and extension until the end of the year. Forward moved, Strutz second to approve extension to December 31, 2012, which will deny right of first refusal, roll call approved.

Committee Reports: Police, Chief Roberts explained the current issue with the public safety radios. The radios were narrowbanded to meet the new FCC regulation but are now unable to communicate with state radio. The problem is the distance from the State towers. Dickey County Emergency Manager has been contacted and is working on possible options to correct this error. Engel commended the police department on their hard work. Parks, Brandriet stated he has been informed that the park garbages are being used for disposal of game cleaning waste, signs will be made and notices published to try and stop this. Garbage, the new garbage route is being worked on and notices will be mailed and published shortly before implementation. Nelson and Haring will work on it and report back to committee. Community Service Project, Dan Spellerberg, FFA Director, asked if his FFA Chapter could do a community service project of trimming boulevard trees that have become a nuisance in some areas; Council approved request and Nelson will help with any questions or concerns.

New Business:

Lot 5 Block 37 EOP, property was acquired by City through delinquent tax sale and the home was demolished. Forward moved, Brandriet second to place empty lot on bids with a minimum purchase price of \$2,500, carried.
