City Council Meeting November 5, 2012

The City Council met at 6:00 PM at SE Regional Career and Technology Center-Community Room with the following members present: Mayor Zimmer and Council: Brandriet, Forward, Strutz, Engel and Sitzler. Harris was absent. Visitors present: Jerry Hollingsworth, Ethel Erickson, Dave Locken, Nick Gludt-Moore Engineering, and Jerod Klabunde-Moore Engineering. Employees present: Pat Nelson, Marke Roberts, and April Haring.

Engineer Report:

2012-2 Phase 3, construction is finished, still will be withholding final payment until seeding areas are addressed. Sitzler moved, Forward second to approve partial pay estimate #6 to Kvamsdal Construction for \$16,958.00, carried. Engel moved, Strutz second to approve engineering invoice to Moore Engineering for \$2,002.50, carried.

2012-2 Phase 4, paving is scheduled to begin within the next few days; seeding will be completed in the spring along with sprinkler repairs. Sitzler moved, Engel second to approve partial pay estimate #3 to Kuechle Underground for \$527,197.20, carried. Engel moved, Sitzler second to approve engineering invoice to Moore Engineering for \$58,724.93, carried. Additional work has been reviewed to replace the broken section of forcemain in the lagoon. Strutz moved, Engel second to proceed with obtaining a quote to fix the sanitary sewer main between 11th Street and Huebner Trailer Court, carried.

Cline's Addition, the project has been abandoned but there are still outstanding engineering invoices. Sitzler moved, Strutz second to approve payment of engineering invoice to Moore Engineering for \$2,192.50 and for \$2,750.00, carried.

2011 Hazard Mitigation Grant Application, notice has been received the City was denied funding due to Dickey County not having a completed and approved Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan.

Water Treatment Plant, review was done for possible filter replacement; the recommendation was a replacement is not needed this year. Sitzler moved, Strutz second to approve Moore Engineering invoice for \$3,500 for technical assistance on filter replacement.

Northwest Drainage, approval has been received from most entities, still waiting for NRCS to give final approval for drainage. The landowner will need to get a certified wetland determination in order for the work to begin.

Committee Reports:

Landfill, Pat Nelson is working with Department of Health on soil testing potential new landfill sites, more information will be given once the testing is completed. **Engineering Invoices**, Sitzler moved, Forward second to bill landowner engineering fees for preliminary design and the City pay for additional services

from the streets fund, carried. **Building Permit Petition**, a petition was received regarding a building permit approved for Nathan O'Brien for a new building at Lots 5 & 6 Block 23 Washburns. The petition was signed by neighbors requesting the decision be reconsidered. O'Brien has withdrawn his application and a discussion was held in regards to how the situation was handled. The applicant was not contacted by any of the concerned parties and no information was obtained from City Hall during the circulation of the petition. The structure followed all City Zoning and Use Ordinances.

Unfinished Business:

Dangerous Building/Abatement Applications, 715 Main Avenue has been acquired by the City. Brandriet moved to demolish the structure and use as parking lot, motion died for lack of second. Sitzler moved, Forward second to introduce and approve RESOLUTION TO ABATE THE TAXES AND SPECIALS FOR 2011 AND 2012 FOR LOTS 8 & 9 BLOCK 21 MCCARTHYS ADDITION, roll call approved. Sitzler moved, Forward second to place the property on bids, carried.

New Business:

First Reading Sales Tax Request, Oakes Parks and Recreation for \$5,000 for new playground equipment at Willow Park.

Special Event Permit, Strutz moved, Sitzler second to approve special event permit for Angry Beaver Lodge on November 24, 2012, at Armory for an anniversary party, carried.

First Reading Public Consumption of Alcohol Ordinance to prohibit the sale and consumption of alcohol upon any public right-of-way, street, alley, highway or public sidewalk within the city; penalty for violating is a \$50 fine.

Annual Employee Evaluations and Salary Adjustments, all evaluations were turned in and acceptable for increases. Sitzler moved, Forward second to approve a cost of living adjustment for all employees effective January 1, 2013. Salaries will be discussed again during the benefit review in the spring to determine if an additional step increase will be given to employees; if granted it will be paid retroactive to January 1, 2013.
