City Council Meeting October 6, 2021

The City Council met at 6:00 PM at Oakes Community Center with the following members present: Mayor O'Brien, Council: Day, Bakke, Harris, and Bagley. Visitors present: Presley Forward. Employees present: Jason Paradis, Matt O'Brien, Matt Schaefer, Pat Nelson, Darrick Nitschke and Zasha Johnson.

<u>Final Budget Hearing</u>: Johnson presented the proposed final budget for 2022 totaling \$420,051.24. The number of mills levied for the budget are slightly below the amount levied in 2021. Bakke moved, Day second to approve budget as presented, roll call Harris-yes, Bakke-yes, Bagley-yes, Day-yes, carried.

New Business:

Property Tax Abatement: request was received from the property owner of N 10' Lot 11 & All Lots 12-13 Block 35 Washburn's Addition. Day moved, Bakke second to approve abatement as presented, roll call: Harris-yes, Bakke-yes, Bagley-abstain, and Day-yes, carried.

Property Tax Exemption: construction exemption request was received from the property owner of Lot 3 Block 8 Washburn's Addition. Harris moved, Day second to approve exemption as presented, carried. **Landfill Noncompliance:** The city received a letter from the state department of environmental quality regarding the condition of our landfill site. Several issues were identified and will need to be resolved to ensure the site remains open. Nelson and Nitschke will work with our district representative to come up with and implement a plan to comply with requirements.

Announcements & Correspondence:

Email was received from a resident about mosquito spraying concerns. It was explained that the spray needs to be used when the mosquitos are out which is around dusk. During this time of year that is earlier than mid-summer and individuals may need to adjust their schedules if they wish to avoid the spray. More attempts will be made to provide advanced notice of plans to spray going forward.
