

UNACCEPTABLE WASTE

THE ITEMS LISTED BELOW ARE NOT ALLOWED IN HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE:

As per the North Dakota State Department of Health Municipal Solid Waste Landfill Regulations and Dakota Landfill Policies:

1. Ash from municipal incinerators; resource recovery facilities, or power plants.
2. Lead acid batteries.
3. Liquids, except those amounts normally found in household waste,
 - a. Cooking oil is considered a liquid
 - b. A paint filter test can be performed on wastes to determine if they in fact meet this criterion. If after 5 minutes, liquid passes through the filter, the waste has failed the test and cannot be accepted for landfill disposal.
4. Waste oil. Waste oil filters that have not been top punctured and drained.
5. Pesticide containers which are not empty and have not been triple-rinsed, except those found normally in household waste. Containers must have holes punched in top and bottom.
6. Raw or digested sewage sludges, lime sludges, grit chamber cleanings, bar screenings, and other sludges if not included in the permit.
7. Hazardous waste, except those amounts normally found in household waste. This includes ignitables (solvents, paints, and fuels), corrosives (acids and alkalies), reactives, toxicity characteristic wastes, and listed wastes.
8. Radioactive wastes, combustible or ignitable waste, foundry waste, oil and gas exploration waste.
9. Animal manure.
10. Septic tank pumpings.
11. Quantities of soluble wastes (fly ash, salt, etc.)
12. Industrial wastes:
 - a. Bulk chemical containers containing residue, PCB waste of concentrations less than 50 ppm, rendering and slaughterhouse waste, contaminated soils, paint residues or filters or dust, sludges, resin waste, municipal lime sludge, spent activated carbon filters, agricultural waste, sunflower ash and special wastes.
